HELLO SCHOOL PRINCIPALS, DEANS, + TEACHERS:

We are so excited to begin the Red Letter Challenge (RLC) Kids journey with you.

First, we want to say thank you for being willing to teach your students about Jesus. Leading children to the Savior so that they can become greater followers of Him is a high calling and an honor of which to be a part.

What is the RLC Kids book? The book is the foundation of our 40-day adventure together. It follows along with the original *Red Letter Challenge* book (meant for youth and adults) and is great when used alongside one another. What makes this experience so unique is that it involves the entire family, what a special opportunity! The *RLC Kids* book will last over 40 days starting with 5 days of introduction, or Warm-Up, in which the 5 principles of Red Letter Challenge are presented: *Being, Forgiving, Serving, Giving, Going*

The following five weeks dive into each individual principle, digging deeper into how Jesus lived out the principles and how we can challenge ourselves to start putting Jesus' words into actions.

Research shows that kids learn through story, so we did not stop with 40 daily devotionals in RLC Kids! Interwoven is a 7-part Winds of Redvale novelette written by Doug Peterson, author of many Veggie Tales books, as well as other literature. We have found that this is often the kid's favorite part!

What is the RLC Kids School-Based Curriculum? It is a flexible, day-by-day guide to implementing this 40-day discipleship experience into any classroom or Bible/Confirmation class. It offers a variety of enhancements to the book such as:

- Easy day-by-day lesson plans to follow
- Completely customizable daily lessons to fit any specific class, time frame, and style
- Grade and age-specific activities, projects, and discussion questions related to the text
- FREE activities and resources offered on our website
- A detailed plan to encourage family involvement and parent connection through a personalized Commitment Letter and family-based activities and prayers.

I am a teacher, how do I use these lessons? We encourage facilitators to begin with the agenda items each day and then add in the provided optional activities for enrichment if time allows. These lessons are written to fit your needs so you can:

- Follow our plans as presented for easy and quick prep beforehand or
- Make them your own by adding, changing, or mixing and matching for your optimal needs.

How long will this take? The goal is to complete the book in 40 days! In order to accomplish this, students will have homework in the form of challenges during the week as well as bonus readings and activities to complete on Saturday and Sunday. There are options for the kids to choose every day. These are not intended to be a burden, but something they can look forward to accomplishing every day!

- Collect Commitment Letters. (1-2 min)

- Introduce Day 1: BEING Warmup. (1-2 min)
- Read p.16 - p.18 (10-15 min)
 - Discussion Questions:
 - What are the 5 principles of RLC Kids?
 - What are some ways we can be with or spend time with Jesus?
 - If we start being with Jesus, what happens next? (DOING)
 - How does God relate to us?
- Activities (Optional): (25-30 min)
 - Review Bible Verses and recite Memory Verse (choral recitation). - K-5
 - Review the "Number 40" in the Bible and how it relates to "testing." - 3-5
 - Option: have students or student groups read about Israelites wandering for 40 years (Num. 14:26-38), Moses on Sinai for 40 days (Ex. 24:12-18), and Jesus in the desert for 40 days (Matt. 4:1-11); have groups share their findings.
 - Students draw/write/act out the three ways we can be with Jesus. - K-5
 - Option: have student groups brainstorm and present ideas/answers to Discussion Question "ii" above after reading Being and Doing, p. 17.
- Review HW assignments. (1-2 min)
- Closing Prayer. (1-2 min)

HOMEWORK:

- Review Memory Verse.
- Read and complete p.19 in RLC Kids book with parents/guardians.
- Pray as a family that God will show you ways to be with Him through reading the Bible, worshiping Him, and praying with Him. Ask forgiveness for missing opportunities to spend time with Him.



- Review HW - p.19 (4-5 min)
 - Ask students to share about their friends.
- Introduce Day 2: Forgiving warmup. (1-2 min)
- Read p.20 - p.21 (students complete couch drawing) (10-15 min)
 - Discussion Questions:
 - How are we like the couch you've just drawn?
 - How does God forgive us of our sins and wrongdoings?
 - What does Forgiving a friend or family member look like?
 - What does Forgiving others do?
- Activities (Optional): (25-30 min)
 - Review and recite the memory verse. (choral recitation) - K-5
 - Have students discuss ways that we can practice Forgiving others. - K-5
 - Option: have students or student groups discuss or develop plans and steps to forgive someone for "wrongs" they commit.
 - Review specific Bible stories which focused on the need for forgiveness. - 3-5
 - Options: Jesus prayed for those who hurt Him (Luke 6:27-36), Joseph forgave his brothers who sold him into slavery (Gen. 50:15-21), David forgave King Saul for wanting to kill him (1 Sam. 24:10-22), Jesus teaching Peter to forgive 77 times (Matt. 18:21-35).
- Review HW Assignments. (1-2min)
- Closing Prayer. (1-2 min)

HOMEWORK:

- Review and recite the memory verse.
- Read and complete p.21 in book with parents/guardians.
- As a family, thank God for His forgiveness and the opportunities to forgive those around us.



 - Discussion Questions:
 - Why do some people think of serving like using a punch card?
 - If God forgives us of everything, why do we need to serve?
 - Will serving others save you?
- Activities (Optional): (25-30 min)
 - Review and recite the memory verse. (choral recitation) - K-5
 - Read and Share: Read Luke 7:36-50 with students. - 3-5
 - Option: Have students or student groups discuss and share ways that they can serve God in the church or community.
 - Have students discuss or draw what serving looks like to them. - K-2
 - Option: Ask for students to share examples of what they think serving looks like and if anyone has volunteered to serve before.
- Review HW Assignments. (1-2 min)
- Closing Prayer. (1-2 min)

 - p.32 - p.41
- Activities (Optional): (25-30 min)
 - Tithe Time (P.27): math skills exercises. - 3-5
 - Winds of Redvale Discussion Questions. - 3-5
 - Winds of Redvale Coloring Sheets. - K-2
- Review Weekend HW Assignments. (1-2 min)
- Closing Prayer. (1-2 min)

AGENDA:


- Opening Prayer. (1-2 min)
- Review HW and 5 principles from previous week. (4-5 min)
 - Ask students which warmup was their favorite and why.
- Introduce Day 6: BEING - Abide In My Word. (1-2 min)
- Read p.43 - p.47 (10-15 min)
 - Discussion Questions:
 - Why did Jesus tell so many stories?
 - How does the Bible, God's Holy Word, show us how to live?
 - How do we, like Ezekiel, "eat" the Word?
- Activities (Optional): (25-30 min)
 - Review Bible Verses and recite memory verse. (choral recitation) - K-5
 - Review specific Bible Verses that focus on the Word as food and life. - 3-5
 - Options: Psalm 107:9, John 6:35, Matthew 4:4, John 6:27, Matthew 5:6, John 7:37, John 6:57.
 - Hide and Seek (with and without the "guidebook") Activity. - K-5
 - Option: Hide an object in a room (in a tough spot to find), have students look for the object based upon a short description of the object. Then, offer a "guidebook" (instructions to find the object) to students as they are looking. Discuss how the Bible is like a "guide" for our lives in how to find Jesus, our purpose, and happiness.
 - Make-Up Monday: Work with students to complete work from previous weekend.
- Review Challenges and HW Assignments; distribute Week 2 Take Home Sheet. (1-2 min)
- Closing Prayer. (1-2 min)

HOMEWORK:

- Review and recite the memory verse.
- Read challenges on p.47 with parents/guardians; choose and start the challenge.
- As a family, praise God for providing His Word, the Bible, to all of us.



WEEK OF BEING | DAY 7



THEME:

BEING with Jesus.

BIBLE VERSES:

Hebrews 12:1-2

OBJECTIVE:

Students will be able to explain how to BE with Jesus on a daily basis and why it is so important.

MEMORY VERSE:

"And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith..." Hebrews 12:2

AGENDA:

- Opening Prayer (1-2 min)
- Review HW and challenge from previous day (4-5 min)
 - Ask students to share their favorite Bible story or what they read in the Bible.
- Introduce Day 7: BEING - Pray Earnestly. (1-2 min)
- Read p.48 - p.51 (10-15 min)
 - Discussion Questions:
 - What does it mean to "pray earnestly?"
 - What are the 3 ways God answers prayer?
 - What are some ways we can pray? (p.51)
- Activities (Optional): (25-30 min)
 - Review and recite the memory verse. (choral recitation) - K-5
 - Have students share and then pray for God's guidance. - K-5
 - Option: Ask students what that they are afraid of, what they are having trouble with, or what they are mad at; lead them in prayer.
 - Blindfolded and Looking Activity - K-5
 - Option: Put an object in the front left corner of the room; have a blindfolded student set out from the front right corner to find the object and return to the right corner. Then have two students hold a piece of rope or string from the front right corner to the object in the left corner. Have another blindfolded student complete the task using the rope as a guide. Discuss how prayer is like a guiding rope for our life.
- Review Challenges and HW Assignments. (1-2 min)
- Closing Prayer. (1-2 min)

HOMEWORK:

- Review and recite the memory verse.
- Read challenges on p.51 with parents/guardians; choose and start the challenge.
- Pray as a family using the A-C-T-S acronym or the Lord's Prayer.



WEEK OF BEING | DAY 8



THEME:

BEING with Jesus.

BIBLE VERSES:

Hebrews 12:1-2

OBJECTIVE:

Students will be able to explain how to BE with Jesus on a daily basis and why it is so important.

MEMORY VERSE:

"And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith..." Hebrews 12:2

AGENDA:


- Opening Prayer using A-C-T-S or reciting the Lord's Prayer. (1-2 min)
- Review HW and challenge from previous day. (4-5 min)
 - Ask students to share which challenge they started and why.
- Introduce Day 8: BEING - Worship the Lord Your God. (1-2 min)
- Read p.52 - p.55 (10-15 min)
 - Discussion Questions:
 - What can worship look like in our daily lives?
 - What are three ways we can worship? (words, actions, songs)
 - What are some idols that we have today?
 - Who lived the perfect example of a life of worship? How?
- Activities (Optional): (25-30 min)
 - Review and recite the memory verse. (choral recitation) - K-5
 - Read and Share: Hebrews 9:1-9 and Matthew 27:45-54 with students - 3-5
 - Option: Have a set of students or student groups read Hebrews 9:1-9 and share the purpose of the curtain in the Temple. Have another set of students or student groups read Matthew 27:45-54 and share why the curtain was ripped from top to bottom. Discuss how we are allowed to enter in and worship God anytime or anywhere.
 - Have students discuss or draw what worshipping looks like to them - K-2
 - Options: Ask for students to share examples of what they think worshipping looks like. See if anyone has a favorite worship song.
- Review Challenges and HW Assignments. (1-2 min)
- Closing Prayer. (1-2 min)

HOMEWORK:

- Review and recite the memory verse.
- Read Challenges on p.55 with parents/guardians; choose and start the challenge.
- Worship as a family together by listening to a favorite Christian praise song.



WEEK OF BEING | DAY 9



THEME:

BEING with Jesus.

BIBLE VERSES:

Hebrews 12:1-2

OBJECTIVE:

Students will be able to explain how to BE with Jesus on a daily basis and why it is so important.

MEMORY VERSE:

"And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith..." Hebrews 12:2

AGENDA:


- Opening Prayer. (1-2 min)
- Review HW and challenge from previous day. (4-5 min)
 - Ask students to share their favorite Worship song or experience.
- Introduce Day 9: BEING - Go to a Quiet Place Alone and Rest Awhile. (1-2 min)
- Read p.56 - p.59 (students complete weekly calendar) (10-15 min)
 - Discussion Questions:
 - Why is it important to have alone time with God?
 - When is a good time to call on Jesus?
 - When can you schedule some rest and alone time with God?
 - What was Martin Luther able to do while alone with God? What was John able to do while alone with God?
- Activities (Optional): (25-30 min)
 - Review and recite the memory verse. (choral recitation) - K-5
 - Rest and Alone Time - 3-5
 - Option: Ask students to share prayer requests and read Luke 5:16. Then have students find spaces in the room (away from each other) so they can have some Alone time with God to pray and listen to God.
- Rest and Alone Time (together) - K-2
 - Options: Ask students to share prayer requests and read Luke 5:16. Then, as an example, the teacher will share how they get alone with God and show how they pray by praying for the student's requests.
- Review Challenges and HW Assignments. (1-2 min)
- Closing Prayer. (1-2 min)

HOMEWORK:

- Review and recite the memory verse. (Test tomorrow!)
- Read Challenges on p.59 with parents/guardians; choose and start the challenge.
- As a family, thank God for being able to complete the challenges in RLC Kids.

Big Idea

Why are the red letters of Jesus important?

Dear Parents:

In the Red Letter Challenge, we are committing to putting the words of Jesus into practice for the next five weeks. Those five weeks are divided into five themes: Being, Forgiving, Serving, Giving, and Going. Each week we will have different ideas and ways that your child(ren) can try to put Jesus' words into practice.

- **BEING:** So many times Jesus talks about the importance of spending time and just being with Him. Before he invites us to do things for Him, through Him, in His name, he invites us into a relationship. Our relationship with Him will determine how effective we are at actually doing the things He asks.
- **FORGIVING:** Jesus is all about 'dat grace. So many of us struggle with receiving God's forgiveness, forgiving ourselves, or forgiving others. To truly represent Jesus in this world, we have a great understand of God's grace in our lives and extend that grace to others.
- **SERVING:** After spending time being with Him, and receiving His forgiveness, now we are so motivated. After all that He's done for me, I want to serve Him. I want to get out into the community, help those in need, love my neighbors, etc.
- **GIVING:** Jesus talked about the Kingdom of heaven more than anything else. A close second was money. I've found through the words of Jesus it's impossible to be a stingy Christian. Jesus followers are generous.
- **GOING:** It's no coincidence that many of Jesus' last words in each of the Gospels and even the last command He says in the book of Acts centers on the fact that we as Jesus followers must not just be His hands and feet in the community, but also His mouthpiece. We are to go out there and tell the Good News that this same Jesus that has died on the cross for my sins and forgiven what I've done has done the same for everyone

Keep an eye out for these weekly handouts and help your child accomplish one, some or all the challenges.

Big Idea

Why is BEING with Jesus important?

Dear Parents:

Today we learned the importance of being with Jesus. There is no time like now for kids to start to get introduced to the concept of spiritual disciplines. These disciples will be practiced all throughout this 40 day challenge,

but specifically this week we want to focus on just BEING with Jesus. Later in our Challenge there will be many opportunities for kids to do more outwardly focused challenges, but we believe that Jesus teaches and models spending time with God the Father is what fuels the rest of his ministry.

So like Jesus, we want our kids to understand from the very beginning that our doing flows out of our being, because the strength that we are using is always Christ's strength and not by our own human attempts.

Talk to your child about the ways that you personally BE with Jesus. Use some of the ideas below to start some new habits as a family this week!

Challenge: ways your child can BE this week:

- Get a Bible that is appropriate for your age level. If you have a Bible already, put it on your nightstand and try to read a page or a section every day as a family before bed or on your own.
- Listen to worship music
- Celebrate and thank God for five things He has done for you. Plan a party to celebrate!

Big Idea

Why is FORGIVING like Jesus important?

Dear Parents:

Forgiveness was the theme this week! Sometimes kids find it easier to forgive than adults do! Forgiveness is something we start teaching our kids at a young age, because we can all understand what it feels like to be hurt by someone.

Forgiveness is something that is so easy to talk about, but really hard to actually do. For kids, we start with the importance of obedience before understanding. We don't always understand completely how forgiveness works, or even why we need to forgive, but actually saying the words out loud and keeping them from getting revenge is the first steps in the lifelong lesson of practicing forgiveness.

Share your own personal stories of how you've been hurt and had to forgive. Use everyday events like someone cutting you off on the road or a mistake at a restaurant or even times when you have to break a promise you made to your child to talk through forgiveness. We forgive our children, and sometimes our children have to forgive us! When offenses happen in a family, use those as starting points to talk about forgiveness and healing.

Challenge: ways your child can FORGIVE this week:

- Write some sins that you have committed on the rocks below, or write some sins that you are angry at someone else about on that rock. Instead of throwing those rocks: drop them at Jesus feet. He will take care of it all for you. Pray about the things you wrote on your rocks.
- Forgive someone today. Don't just say, "It's OK" or "No problem!" Actually say, "I forgive you."

Big Idea

Why is SERVING like Jesus important?

Dear Parents:

Today we talked about the awesome opportunity we have to both understand our own gifts and talents and then using those to help and serve others. We discussed motive for serving and that we love and serve because Christ first loved and served us. Our serving ultimately comes as a response to God's redeeming love on the cross for us and His continued love and service to us: taking care of us every day.

Talk with your child this week about what unique gifts and talents God has given to them. Use the list below to match up and see how they can serve this week!

Ways you can SERVE this week:

- Serve someone today who can't or won't pay you back.
- Make some cookies and bring it to them.
- Offer to pull weeds for them.
- Bring them flowers.
- Make them a cheerful card.
- Offer to play with some younger kids in the neighborhood so their mom can work in the yard or around the house.
- Offer to walk their dog for them.

Big Idea

Why is GIVING to Jesus important?

Dear Parents:

Many of the targets of Red Letter Challenge are things that will progress as children grow into adulthood: but often kids grasp things even easier than adults do! The giving principle is often something that is often even easier for kids to do than adults! It will amaze you at their generosity, when you give them opportunities to give and share.

We talk about motive for giving, as well as who is the Ultimate Giver, Jesus. Understanding what Jesus has given to us helps us give freely to whoever needs it. We give because we have been given everything.

Not accepting and allowing them to give extravagantly like that stifles something that is so beautiful inside. If during this week they feel prompted to give something that makes you hesitate, that's normal! Let them give! And give freely!

Challenge: ways you can GIVE this week:

- Give food to the needy. Ask your parents or an adult if you can help clear out your cupboards or go shopping and collect food for the needy. Find a church or a food pantry in your area to drop off the food to.
- Go through closets and empty out drawers of clothes/toys to give away to a neighbor or a local second hand store or women's shelter.

Big Idea

Why is GOING with Jesus important?

Dear Parents:

As we wrap up this Red Letter Challenge, we don't end with an easy task! Going is sometimes hard for kids to understand because they are always told "go brush your teeth", "go clean your room", "go to school". Going to kids just feels like a command to obey, rather than an invitation to adventure! We want to instill in our children the understanding that GOING with Jesus is not a task to be completed, but an adventure to embark on! It should be thrilling and intriguing.

And it doesn't matter how young they are, they are called on a great commission to be a witness. They have the Holy Spirit with them at all times, and they never go alone.

Challenge: ways your child can GO this week:

- Have dinner with your family sometime this week. Maybe you do this every day and this is a super easy challenge for you. If it is, I want you to lead the family in prayer before dinner.
- Say hello to neighbors you haven't met yet. Make them some bread or warm cookies or bring them flowers.
- Or, say hello to someone you don't know at school or at practice or at church. Offer to help them or sit with them. Ask them what their name is and tell them yours. The first step in making a new friend is as simple as "hello!"
